# ST. JOSEPH FOUNDATION AND THE NISSWA LIONS CLUB PROVIDE GRANTS TO MAKE LAFS DOORS ADA COMPLIANT



The St. Joseph's Foundation recently awarded a \$12,500 grant to Lakes Area Food Shelf to make our doors ADA (American Disabilities Act) compliant and accessible. New ramps into and exiting the building have been redone, and new doors and automatic door

openers will be installed before winter.

In addition to The St. Joseph's Foundation grant, the Nisswa Lions donated \$5,000 to the project. Travis Miller serves as the architect for the project, and Hy-Tech Construction was awarded the construction bid.

This is an essential project for the food shelf, as it will greatly enhance safe entry and exit for our friends and neighbors; our volunteers; and the general public.

#### THANKSGIVING GROCERY BOXES TO BE DISTRIBUTED TO FRIENDS AND NEIGHBORS



Again, this year, Lakes Area Food Shelf will be putting together boxes of Thanksgiving foods for our friends and neighbors. Grace United Methodist Church will be partnering on the assembly and distribution of the boxes. Foods will include turkeys or turkey breasts; dressing; potatoes; sweet potatoes; Jell-O; whipped topping; green beans; celery; pumpkin; cranberries, and other items.

Already, we have almost fifty families signed up, and we anticipate one hundred or more. One of the mothers who recently signed up for the box of Thanksgiving treats stated, "Oh, my gosh. Thank you so much. I didn't think it would even be possible to have a Thanksgiving meal this year. Thank you, thank you!"

#### **EQUIPMENT UPGRADES NEEDED**

Lakes Area Food Shelf has been in existence for thirty years, and over that time, it has served tens of thousands of our friends and neighbors. Former Board members and Directors, hundreds of volunteers, thousands of donors, and others in our community have made it the outstanding food shelf that it is today.

This past summer, we were fortunate to receive a grant from Hunger Solutions to purchase new shopping carts; a floor scale and ramps to weigh incoming and outgoing food; a stainless-steel table on which to sort ready-to-eat foods; and other smaller pieces of equipment which greatly enhance our operations.

We are blessed to have two walk-in freezers and a walk-in cooler in which to store food. Yet, in the last six months, we have had five separate Freon leaks between the two freezers, the last one resulting in a major food loss. The freezers are old (one purchased in 1999 and the other in 2014), and serious upgrades are needed to them as well as to our heating and cooling system. All totaled, the cost of the project is bid at \$38,000. We are seeking support from businesses, civic groups, churches, foundations, and individuals in the Brainerd Lakes Area to help fund this major equipment upgrade. ### FRESH PRODUCE A GIFT FOR OUR FRIENDS AND NEIGHBORS!!







This past Spring, we made a commitment to provide healthier foods to the friends and neighbors who come to Lakes Area Food Shelf. We have benefitted from the donation of much garden produce from Crow Wing County Master Gardeners; local gardeners; community and church gardens; and others. Fresh green beans, lettuce, carrots, beets, cucumbers, tomatoes, potatoes, onions, kale, radishes, and more! In addition, we order fresh fruit weekly, including apples, oranges, grapes, and other seasonal fruits from Second Harvest Food Bank and Northwestern Fruits. These foods have been welcomed additions to our friends and neighbors, as noted in their comments:

- "Usually, I can't buy this stuff. I am lucky if I have enough money for just the necessities for my family. This is just great. My little girl loves carrots."
- "Thank you for caring that we have healthy food. I never imagined finding such fresh fruit here."
- "You know, when you live like I do, you get used to canned food. It's cheap, and it's what I can afford. I
  really appreciate you bringing fresh vegetables here. I usually can't afford to buy it."

We are excited to announce an exciting partnership with Brakstad Farms, Pequot Lakes, MN, to provide locally grown fresh produce to the food shelf!! Robyn and Lance Brakstad have already been planning an increased garden spot for Lakes Area Food Shelf in 2022!
