While this Impact Report contains data about how many families we served; how many pounds of food we distributed; and how many individual visits we had in 2022, the greatest way we can convey the impact of your generosity is by sharing comments from two of the many families who benefitted.

"Between my husband and I, we work three jobs and still struggle to make ends meet.
 Our rent increased by \$475 in just a year. If it wasn't for this place – for the food we get here – we would be on the street."



• "I don't want to need a food shelf. I feel badly coming here because I know there are people worse off than me. But I just can't afford everything at the end of the month, you know? My car broke down and it cost me \$850 to fix it. That has really set me back. Thank you for being here for me."








Lakes Area Food Shelf is almost entirely donor-driven. We rely on your generosity to meet an evergrowing need. We follow National Council of Foundations Guidelines to keep administrative costs at or less of 30% of our budget.





Lakes Area Food Shelf maintains a "rainy day fund" equal to one year of operating expenses.

Fundraising plans for 2023-2024 are being formed now. A building expansion campaign is underway to house the Community Resource Hub. Funds for operating expenses will be acquired at or above the 2022 level through sources identified in the "2022 Support and Revenue" graphic above.
